You can do as many or as few as you like.

Easter Chick

Make an Easter Chick with pompoms. You do not need a glue gun. You can use ordinary glue (not pritt stick) or put a couple of stitches between the pompoms. You can use cardboard to cut out some duck feet instead of using pipe cleaners. There are videos to show you what to do on the link below.

Bunny Caddy



Got any spare toilet rolls?! Make some little bunny caddies!

You'll need: an empty toilet roll, glue, a marker and some coloured and white paper.

Wrap your roll with the coloured paper. Fold coloured paper in half and cut bunny ears. Do the same with the white paper but make them smaller. Attach as in the picture. Draw your bunny face...not forgetting some little bunny teeth. Hide sweets inside (optional!).
